OUR PROGRAMS

Concerts

At the core of our programming, The Boîte is dedicated to providing musicians from diverse cultural backgrounds with professional performance opportunities both large and small, which help them engage with broader audiences and become active contributors to the Melbourne and Regional Victorian music ecology.

Choral Projects

The Boîte has a significant background of over 25 years of delivering massed choral projects involving unauditioned choirs for both adults and children. Each project has featured songs in languages from different regions of the world, and

has featured and been led by an exceptional roll call of cultural artistic leaders.

Intercultural Projects & New Works

The Boîte supports artists by providing space and resources for the creation of new works, with a particular focus on intercultural collaborations.

Professional Development

The Portfolio Project supports culturally diverse emerging artists with skills and tools which prepare them to be competitive in a mainstream music marketplace. In its 3 years, Portfolio has supported 31 acts, amongst which many have since been presented at major festivals and venues, released albums successfully, and accessed adjacent opportunities in the sector.

Engagement and Sector Development

The Boîte actively supports projects involving engagement across both our community and our sector, strengthening relationships with key organisations and partners, and building connections for artists and marginalised communities. Key activities include community choirs involving a language other than English, mentoring and business support for niche projects with clear impacts on community wellbeing, and activities designed to expand networks and support systems for artists.
